

# Coronavirus (COVID-19)



Any time your child needs to work at home because of our coronavirus measures, we will use a combination of National Curriculum linked workbooks and Seesaw. Seesaw helps us work together to provide students with meaningful learning experiences at home.

We'll use Seesaw to share learning activities and resources, capture your child's learning, and communicate about student progress and needs.

Below are steps for setting up Seesaw at home and additional resources to help you support your child to learn at home. We recommend you try and access your child's Seesaw account now, and contact school if you have any issues logging on.

## Set up your child in the Seesaw Class App


1. For devices like tablets or phones, download the **Seesaw Class App**  
For laptop or desktop computers, **go to [app.seesaw.me](https://app.seesaw.me)**
2. Click **I'm a Student**
3. We will provide home learning codes: **Enter the text code** or **scan the QR code**



Families who can't access Seesaw, for any reason, will need to arrange to pick-up and drop-off learning packs from the school office every day while their child is not able to be in school.



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## What you need to know about home education

In the event of a local lockdown or confirmed case, Carville Primary School may be required to partially close, and we are asking that, wherever possible, you assist your children with their learning at home during this period. We understand this is difficult, and we are here to help!

### Supporting your child's learning

#### Top tips for supporting your child while they learn from home:

- Keep to a routine as much as possible so your child knows what to expect.
- Keep active – ensure your child is getting enough exercise and incorporate this into their daily routine.
- Use different methods to assist learning, e.g. online programmes and documentaries.
- Stay sociable – organise with other parents to arrange video calls with your child's friends so they can stay connected during social hours.

#### For younger children, you can:

- Incorporate learning in make-believe play.
- Play educational games with numbers or letters and read together.
- Involve them in things you are doing, e.g. chores, and talk with them about it.

### Contacting the school

We will provide you with all the details you may need for home learning and contacting the school during a Bubble closure or local lockdown period. Here are four important things you and your child need to remember:

When using Seesaw the work and photographs you submit should be appropriate to the task.

Questions for teachers will only be answered between the time periods you are given.

Understand that staff may not always be able to help, but they will try their best.

Remember to act in the same manner as if the school were open.
